

Yale University TEACH Grant

Yale University TEACH Grant is a federal award that provides financial aid to students who plan to become teachers in high-need fields. The grant is available to students who are enrolled in a baccalaureate degree program and who are committed to teaching full-time in a high-need field in a low-income school for four years within eight years of completing their degree.

TEACH Grant Eligibility:

- Have scored at or above the 75th percentile on ACT or SAT*, or maintained a 3.25 cumulative GPA in high school or college
- Plan to enroll in one of Heidelberg's eligible education programs (see below)
- Plan to teach full time in a high-need field in a low-income school
- Plan to teach as a highly qualified teacher for four years within the eight years immediately following completion of your degree

TEACH Grant Fields:

- Middle Childhood (grades 4-9)-Federal subject areas are math and science; Ohio areas are English/language arts and social studies.
- Adolescent to Young Adult (grades 7-12)-Federal areas are math and science; Ohio areas are English/language arts and social studies.
- Multi-age-German and Spanish
- Intervention Specialist

Award Amount:

This award is up to \$4,000 per year with a maximum of \$16,000* for an undergraduate student. Please note: If you do not fulfill the requirement of the Agreement to Serve, the entire TEACH Grant received converts into a Federal Direct Unsubsidized Loan with the interest retroactive to the date the grant was disbursed.

Agreement to Serve Requirements:

You must sign an Agreement to Serve indicating that you understand that you must fulfill a teaching service requirement. You must teach full-time for at least four years within eight years of completing your bachelor's degree, in a low income school in a qualifying high-need field.
