2023- Ongoing	Primary Investigator: Along with one of my undergraduate students, we are exploring the impact of incarceration on mental health. We are surveying people who spent a minimum of two years in prison, who have since released. We are exploring the ability to access mental health resources since returning to the community.
2023- Ongoing	Primary Investigator: <i>Tiffin City Schools School Climate Survey</i> . Along with a colleague and two of my undergraduate students, we have created a school climate survey that will be administered to Middle School and High School Students. Tiffin City Schoolsø Superintendent reached out to me and asked for help in better understanding the experiences of the students.
